She is also a state specialist in family and financial well-being in middle and later life in the Family Living Programs through University of Wisconsin-Extension Cooperative. Her work and expertise are in the psychosocial aspects of illness and how it impacts families and caregivers alike. Dr. Litzelman is excited to share her expertise in caregiver well-being and how best to improve the quality of life for caregivers and their families.
